REPORTING A WILDLIFE CRIME

If you SUSPECT a wildlife crime is taking, or has taken, place – REPORT IT!

First report it to the National Parks & Wildlife Service (NPWS) – tel: (01) 888 2000, www.npws.ie and email WildlifeEnforcement@npws.gov.ie

If an incident is happening in real time, or if there's a risk of a breach of the peace, call An Garda Síochána on 999 and email envi.wildlife.crime@garda.ie

If there is a LIVE animal that has been injured at the scene, use www.irishwildlifematters.ie to find a vet or rehabilitator.



WILDLIFE CRIME AND THE LAW IN IRELAND



What is wildlife crime and why does it matter?

LEGISLATION

Wildlife crime is any act that contravenes current legislation governing the protection of wild birds, mammals, plants and their habitats.

Examples include:

- Bird persecution poisoning or trapping birds, or disturbance of birds near a nest containing eggs or chicks
- Deer poaching illegally hunting deer
- · Use of illegal traps, snares and nets
- · Unlicensed hare netting or illegal coursing
- Badger persecution including baiting, trapping and disturbance of setts
- Fish poaching illegally hunting or capturing fish
- . Bat persecution including disturbance to roosts
- · Removing / damaging protected wild plants / habitats
- Cutting hedgerows during the bird nesting season (Mar-Aug)
- Disturbance of seals and basking sharks
- The trade in protected animals and plants, including species covered by CITES (Endangered Species)

The Animal Health and Welfare Act makes it **illegal** to cause or permit unnecessary suffering.

The Department of Agriculture, the Gardaí, and the ISPCA should be notified of cruelty to any animal.

RECORDING A CRIME



Do NOT put yourself in harm's way – do not approach a suspect or touch anything you suspect may be poisoned

Before you do anything else, it is very important that:

- · You do NOT disturb the scene
- · You do NOT move any items at the scene
- You do NOT mark the site
- · You do NOT do anything illegal yourself
- Once sure that it is safe to do so:
- Record the transport and registration this is very important!
- Record the date and time
- Record the person
- Record the scene
- Record the location

PROTECTION & DEROGATIONS

Enforcement of Protection of Wild Animals

Anyone who hunts, kills, injures or possesses a protected wild animal otherwise than under and in accordance with a licence, or who wilfully interferes with or destroys its breeding or resting place is guilty of an offence (Section 23 of the Irish Wildlife Act 1976).

With a licence granted by the Minister under the Wildlife Acts, derogations (exemptions) can be made to the protection afforded to these animals and their habitats.

IRELAND'S PROTECTED SPECIES

LAND MAMMALS: Badger, Deer Species, Hedgehog, Red Squirrel, Otter, Hare, Stoat, Pine Marten, all Bat species, Pygmy Shrew

MARINE MAMMALS: Dolphin, Porpoise, Seals & Whales

CARTILAGINOUS FISH: Basking shark

REPTILES: Common Lizard, Marine Turtle

AMPHIBIANS: Common Frog, Common Newt,

CRUSTACEAN: Freshwater Crayfish

MOLLUSCS: Freshwater Pearl Mussel, Kerry Slug
